What drives me to pursue a higher education is my dream to be something larger than this town. My dream is to make a difference not only in the LGBTQ+ community but also in everyday society. I want to be

recognized as a professional and as a mentor for the generation of the transgender community after me. I want to lead by example and prove that being a part of a minority you can still become a leader in the majority, and a higher education is the way of doing it. Higher education is a way to learn and experience more of the world. When I was going through my deepest depression and dysphoria, I discovered horticulture. Caring and tending to my plants brought me peace of mind and developed into a healthy coping skill for me. I learned of botany as a career and thought that would be my career path. My thinking process is very scientific and knew I needed to be in a science field. I started the Running Start program my junior year with the goal of botany, but this year I took a science forensic class and peaked my interest. Starting in college, I am learning how much there is in the world and right now I am unsure of a major, but it will be in the science field. No matter what career path I choose, I plan to be a representation of strength in the transgender community to show that we have choices and can be in the professional field and not be defined by the little fields that accept us. As a running start student, I took a semester at WSU were I met a small group of LGBTQ members. Among them was an older student who shared his empowering story. He grew up in a religious family but eventually moved out to Seattle with a group of transgender women and drag queens. He witnessed firsthand what all they had to go through. He would tell me, all I have to do, is make it through school and then get out of this town. There is so much more out there than this tiny town. I looked up to him then and I still do. I dream of becoming someone to be looked up to like I did to him. I hope generations after me can learn from my words and stories, too. I dream on gaining experience and bringing that support that he found in Seattle into the Tri-cities. No matter what field or career I end up in, I hope my path for the transgender community will be made easier due to my experiences.

I think the moments that describes my development as a LGBTQ+ member can't be defined in one moment. As a person I don't think any one event can tell my story. I've gone through so much from getting kicked out, not only from my own home but from friend's homes too, to being only a kid and being screamed at by adults about how I will never become the proud man I am today. Although our transgender community is large here in the Tri-cities, coming out young, especially when I was younger, is so incredible hard to survive through. From my own experiences, I started reaching out to others to help them get through what I had to go through alone. I started a Youtube channel, focusing on trans-masc help, the channel grew with me and I shared my experiences and my advice out on the internet. After I found a group of transgender friends, I started to explore outside of the Tri-cities for more events and found a convention called Gender Odyssey. It's an annual transgender event hosted out in Seattle that brings together such a warming and educational transgender community every year. My first trip was such a rush of acceptance and love that I have never seen before. There I met more and more friends in the community and got to meet surgeons for top and bottom surgery who gave out information I would never find online or here in the Tri-cities. The trip to Gender Odyssey gave me so much hope on getting through the transphobia and gave me the confidence to fight the battles I have to go through every day as a transgender man. I now share my knowledge to the community here in the tri-cities whenever I come across anyone seeking help and I hope to further help our community through the SQUAD club at CBC.

Throughout the years I started filming all my pride events and posed some of them online to share how happy I was to be

apart of thing much larger than me. I got into contact with larger icons in the LGBTQ+ community and even met a few at the Gender odyssey convention.
